Summer 2020: Morocco – Shifting Identities on a Global Frontier



The Location: Located on the northwestern tip of the African continent, Morocco is a culturally rich and geographically stunning country totaling a population of nearly 37 million people. The country lies at an international crossroads, both between the Muslim Middle East and Christian Europe, as well as between the African continent and the broadly-termed West as represented by the states and societies of Europe. The itinerary will include visits to Rabat, Fes, Chefchaouen, Tangier, Marrakech and Casablanca.

Course Work and Highlights: The course seeks to expand student horizons and educate with and from a multidisciplinary perspective during a multicity excursion in Morocco. Student travelers will explore art, architecture, history, culture, politics, and language during their time in country and will balance their travel time between organized and structured group activities including lectures, cultural briefings and museum visits with independent exploration of the markets and well-traveled public spaces of this diverse country. A key theme of the course will be the exploration of identity, both national and regional, and its structure for participants.

Housing: Students will stay in double rooms in three-star hotels.
