► WHY LONDON?

London is an amazing place to be a student. There are world famous galleries, museums, theatres, festivals and parks to explore – many of them for free. One of the world's great capitals, London is a city of ideas and the imagination. British people are fiercely independent thinkers, so London's creative milieu is abundantly original, from theatrical innovation to contemporary art, pioneering music, writing and design. Not all is new; London is immersed in history. There are monuments, museums and art (including Buckingham Palace, the London Eye, the British Museum, Tower of London, and Westminster Abbey) to keep you busy all semester.

► STUDY AT GOLDSMITHS, UNIVERSITY OF LONDON

Goldsmiths is located in South East London, New Cross, which has excellent access to the heart of London. At Goldsmiths, students become part of a diverse student community. Study abroad students at Goldsmiths will meet new people and become involved with a myriad of activities outside of their academic studies. There's no typical student experience at Goldsmiths. When they are not studying, students can take their pick from some of the great things happening on campus, in the local area, and in central London.

► ACADEMICS

Goldsmiths is ranked first in the UK for media and communications, and in the top ten for art and design (according to the complete University Guide 2014). Students can choose courses from the following modules: communication studies, creative and cultural entrepreneurship, design, educational studies, English and comparative literature, history, management studies, music, politics and economics, psychology, social and cultural studies, sociology and visual cultures. Students can take up to four classes per term. There are two fee structures – one for high cost and one for low cost programs. High cost programs are those with a major studio or laboratory content, or which mainly involve art practice, communication studies, computing, design, theatre and performance, music or psychology – or any majority combination of these subjects. It's likely that art students will have to pay for some materials during their course; students will be sent a materials list with details of costs. Further advice on the costs of study is given when students accept an offer of a place.

► STUDENT SERVICES & ACTIVITIES

Goldsmiths is a campus based university in the heart of the New Cross district of London with classes, social activities and accommodation all in one place. The members of the community come from every corner of the world, which makes for a diverse learning experience (and plenty of stimulating conversation).

Just some of the facilities at Goldsmiths include:

- The Goldsmiths library, with over a quarter of a million books
- Club Pulse, a low-cost gym open to students and the public
- The back field, offering leafy green space in South East London
- The award-winning Students' Union, including café NATURA, and bar and venue 'the Stretch'

The Students' Union offers students the opportunity to get involved through volunteer placements or working on the student magazine or radio station, for example. Study abroad students are welcome to join any of the Students' Union clubs and societies. These include language clubs, music, art, photography and film clubs, and sports clubs, among others.

► ACCOMMODATIONS

All study abroad students are entitled to accommodation in the halls of residence (provided that students apply by the deadlines). The majority of study abroad students live in Loring Hall. This accommodation is self-catered and arranged in apartments of four to eight students, with individual bedrooms, en suite bathroom facilities and a shared kitchen.
