► WHY HEIDELBERG?

Famous castle ruins, the oldest university in Germany, nine Nobel prize winners, an authors' and philosophers' favorite from Goethe to Mark Twain, a vibrant cultural and festival metropolis, an outstanding academic and science center, and picturesque nature with a Mediterranean climate. Heidelberg lures you with the old town or "Altstadt" with its red-roofed townscape. Heidelberg is also a city of science and business and is home to Germany's most important centers of research and development (University of Heidelberg, German Cancer Research Center, European Molecular Biology Laboratory, five institutes of the Max Planck Society) and world-famous enterprises such as SAP, Heidelberger Druckmaschinen AG, HeidelbergCement, ABB, SAS, MLP, Springer Science+Business Media, and many others. Heidelberg is one of Germany's most romantic cities: the more you wander around, the more unexpected beauty and heart stopping panoramas you'll discover.

► STUDY AT SRH HEIDELBERG

As one of the oldest and largest private universities in Germany, SRH Heidelberg is renowned for collaborative student and faculty projects that are hands-on, innovative and creative. SRH Heidelberg offers small class sizes, and direct contact with your professors, modern equipment and hands-on course contents.

► ACADEMICS

Classes are taught in English. All lectures are 90 minutes long (in the German system, this is counted as two 45 minute “academic hours”) with a 15 minute break between each lecture. Generally, morning classes are set to begin at 9.30 a.m. (although some do start as early as 7.45 a.m.). After a 75 minute break for lunch, afternoon classes resume at 2.00 p.m. and can take place at any time slot, as well as in the evening. Most students only have a few lectures per day. Normally 15 semester credits will be awarded for 30 SRH Heidelberg ETCS credits.

► STUDENT SERVICES & ACTIVITIES

For keeping fit or just relaxing, the SRH Campus Sports Club is the place to go. You'll find everything there from a fitness center to swimming and taking a sauna or wall climbing and outdoor sports. The club offers over 40 attractive sports and leisure activities under one roof (Including: rowing, inline skating, cycling, running, Nordic walking, basketball, swimming, golf, rugby, hockey and the chance of meeting some of the world famous athletes who use the facilities of the Olympic Training Center and the Institute of Sport and Sport Science). The basic membership fee is already included in tuition at the SRH Heidelberg.

► ACCOMMODATIONS

German universities do not automatically allocate rooms to students when they enroll. This means that even international students are responsible for finding their own accommodation. The International Office of SRH University Heidelberg provides useful information on finding a private or shared flat or a room in a dorm. There are several dorms on campus, which are all managed by SRH Holding and are not run by SRH University Heidelberg. More information can be found at: www.fh-heidelberg.de/en/campus-life/living-on-campus. All rooms in these dorms are furnished with a bed, mattress, desk, chair, bookshelf, and wardrobe. Students who do not have a kitchen in their flat are permitted to have a microwave or an induction cooktop stove in their rooms. As there are only a limited number of dorms rooms available on campus, we recommend that you apply early.

The cafeteria has a-la-carte style meals which provide a wider range of meal options. Meals on average cost about €3.50 with your student ID (subsidized). Salads, snacks, drinks, vegetarian, and diet meals also available.
