The Locations:

Ireland is an island in the North Atlantic, separated between the Republic of Ireland (officially named Ireland) and Northern Ireland. The official languages are English and Irish, also referred to as Gaelic (Gaelige) or the Irish Gaelic language. The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in Ireland was 333.73 billion US dollars in 2017. Ireland's currency is the Euro. This field experience will travel from Pittsburgh to Dublin, with visits to Galway and Belfast.

Coursework and Highlights:

This course introduces students to international business within the context of focusing on the impact of trade to Ireland, particularly in the context of trade with European Union (EU) and non-European Union countries. This course will focus on issues of trade for the Isle of Ireland and how the issues of border between Northern Ireland, which is expected to have the worst economic growth across the UK in 2019, contrast with the Republic of Ireland, a small open trading nation and a member of the EU with a currently strong growth forecast. In addition to trade, the course will focus on immigration issues from an economic and a social perspective. The course will include cultural visits to museums and churches, business and sustainability presentations and site visits, and touring scenic areas including islands, castles and lakes.

Housing:

Students will stay in double rooms in local hotels.

Prerequisite Course:

Students must take or have taken BUS 105, *Foundations of Business* (Spring 2019, MWF, 9:00-9:50 AM).
