► WHY WOLLONGONG?

Wollongong, the ninth largest city in Australia, is located just 45 minutes by train south of Sydney and is the site for Chatham's program down-under. Wollongong is a multicultural commercial, retail and industrial center surrounded by national parks. The University of Wollongong is one of Australia's leading teaching and research institutions. One of the most favorite residence halls is next to the beach. There is a wide selection of water and adventure sports including surfing, scuba diving, hang gliding and bush walking. Learn that a "barbie" is more than a doll and that when someone "shouts" you can keep your money in your pocket.

► STUDY AT WOLLONGONG UNIVERSITY

Instruction is based on the "British" model. Learning is a lot more independent than it is in the United States. You will attend lectures in large halls with many students. These lectures are supplemented with "tutorials" with the professors and a small group of students. "Tutorials" are similar to the US graduate seminar where lecture and reading materials are discussed and debated. Grades are determined on the basis of one final exam or paper. Some professors will have mid-term papers or exams as well. The "British" system is not ideal for procrastinators. You will be
